

ORDINANCE NO. O2017-39

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING
THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE PERMITS TO CHARITABLE
ORGANIZATIONS TO SOLICIT FROM THE OCCUPANT OF A VEHICLE
PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 371.06 (B) (2) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES
OF THE CITY OF GALLIPOLIS, OHIO**

WHEREAS, the City of Gallipolis, Ohio, has received requests from charitable organizations to solicit from the occupant of a vehicle for charitable contributions; and

WHEREAS, the Gallipolis City Commission desires to grant their requests for the well-being of residents of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has recommended in writing the passage of this Ordinance as an emergency measure as it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and property and in order to provide for the usual operations of the municipal departments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Gallipolis, Ohio;

Section 1: That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to the following organizations to solicit from the occupant of a vehicle for charitable contributions as pursuant to Chapter 371.06(b)(2) as provided in ORC 4511.051(A):

Gallipolis Police Department, Gallipolis Volunteer Fire Department, Gallia County Firefighters Association, Veterans Organizations, Gallipolis Lions Club, Gallipolis Shrine Club, Gallipolis Senior Resource Center and Mason-Gallia-Meigs (MGM) Marine Corps to solicit from the occupant of a vehicle at the following specified locations:

Wal-Mart Plaza intersection, 2145 Eastern Avenue, Gallipolis, Ohio

Said permits shall be issued to be valid from November 18, 2017 to December 31, 2017.


Section 2: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon passage as an emergency measure.
